This Letter of Clarification is issued for the following reasons:

• **To revise the above referenced solicitation as follows:**

1. Page 12, Item 12.17 is amended to read: Proposers are encouraged to contact the Mayor's Office of Business Opportunity (OBO) with any questions concerning MWBE participation plans and/or Good Faith Efforts. 2. What is the timeline for this solicitation? What do you envision are the next steps?
Responses are due February 3, 2012. The City will review the responses and determine the timeline for the next step, as well as the next step, at that time.
3. Who will pay for the system?
The taxicab operators will be responsible for purchasing the system and having it installed in their taxicab vehicles.
4. How many taxicabs are there in Houston?
There are approximately 2,400 taxicabs operating in Houston.
5. How many taxicab companies are permitted in Houston?
There are 152 permittees operating in Houston.
6. Please provide a list of all taxicab companies in Houston.
A list of the 152 taxicab permittees is attached to this Letter of Clarification.
7. How many taxicabs operate at the airport(s)?
There are 1,197 cabs registered to operate at Intercontinental Airport (IAH).
8. Is the right to use the airport given to the taxi driver or the company?
The right is for the driver.
9. Has the City considered that some of the meters will need to be replaced?
Yes, the City is aware that some meters may require replacing. Respondents should address the ability to integrate their proposed systems with the meters currently in the Houston taxicab fleet, any required modifications or replacements and the cost.
10. Does the City anticipate allowing the assessment of a convenience fee per transaction?
Yes, the City is open to allowing operators to assess a convenience fee per transaction.
11. Please provide citywide trip/ridership data to allow respondents to better estimate potential transaction quantities.
Citywide trip data is not available. Calendar year 2011 airport trip information is attached.
12. Does a respondent have to submit the Conflict of Interest Questionnaire if the respondent has not contributed to any campaign?
Yes.
14. Please provide clarification for Section C of the Drug Form (No Safety Impact Positions). As the scope of work provides that the portion to be subcontracted will be basic installation (i.e. cabling and mounting brackets...does this apply to respondents? If so, are we allowed to submit this form only after we have subcontracted the work?

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Please refer to the attached Executive Order 1-31 Mayors Drug Detection and Deterrence Procedures for Contractors section 5.18. The Drug forms will need to be submitted with the submitter's RFQ response.

15. Resident Bidder Requirement: If a respondent has a full time employee with a corporate apartment in Houston, and that employee works out of the apartment, does this count as an office for purposes of the Resident Bidder requirement?

Chapter 15, Article XI, Hire Houston First, Sec. 15-176. - Defines the following in order to qualify:

City business means a business with a principal place of business within the city limits.

Local area means the eight counties in and surrounding Houston city limits. The counties are Harris, Fort Bend, Montgomery, Brazoria, Galveston, Chambers, Waller and Liberty.

Local business means a business with a principal place of business in the local area.

Principal place of business means the business must be headquartered or have an established place or places of business in the incorporated limits of the city or the local area, as applicable, from which 20% or more of the entity's workforce are regularly based, and from which a substantial role in the entity's performance of a commercially useful function or a substantial part of its operations is conducted. A location utilized solely as a post office box, mail drop or telephone message center or any combination thereof, with no other substantial work function, shall not be construed as a principal place of business.

16. Will the selected vendor(s) be able to negotiate different fees/prices with different fleet sizes, fleets with differing credit card processing amounts, or fleets that perform more (or less) trips per day than other fleets?

As discussed at the pre-submittal meeting, respondents are asked to provide pricing options to the City, as appropriate for this procurement process. Respondents are asked to provide multiple pricing scenarios as necessary, based on the type and composition of the Houston taxicab fleet.

17. Page 2, Section 2.0, Subsection 2.2 - Can the proposed solution take advantage of dispatch device (MDT) that will be installed at the front seat?

Yes, respondents should be very careful to explain, in great detail, exactly what their proposed solution consists of, as well as alternatives, as appropriate.

18. Page 3, Section 2.0, Subsection 2.5 - Does City of Houston have a list of installed taxi meters?

The installed taxi meter models are predominately Silent 610; however, there are also Silent 620, Mobile Knowledge, Argonaut and Cetredyne.

19. Page, Section 3.1, Subsection 3.1.1.6 - Can City of Houston please clarify which industry standards and success rate will be considered?

It is our understanding that this type of technology has been in place in various cities around the country since approximately 2006. As such, some standards have evolved – such as PCI compliance, same day payment settlement for drivers, passenger control of the credit card at all times, etc. The success rate applies to successful implementation in other jurisdictions.

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20. Page 4, Section 3.1, Subsection 3.1.1.7 - Is it acceptable for a dispatcher/cashier to complete adjustments and voids or does City require drivers to perform those actions?

The city seeks a solution that considers various options.

21. Page 4, Section 3.1, Subsection 3.1.1.8 - is a printer connecting to a front seat MDT acceptable? Is the complaint number the telephone number that customers can call?

Yes, the printer may be connected to a front seat MDT. Yes, the complaint number is the telephone number that customers can call.

22. Page 4, Section 3.1, Subsection 3.1.2.2 - Is the City proposing that the selected vendor(s) pays the independent owner/drivers directly or via taxi management companies?

The City encourages respondents to propose a solution or solutions based on experience in other jurisdictions and the type and composition of the Houston taxicab fleet.

23. Page 5, Section 3.1, Subsection 3.1.2.6 - Is license number the same as the taxi license number?

The license number is the same as the taxi medallion number.

24. Page 6, Section 3.2, Subsection 3.2.1.3 - Is the intent to ensure that PIM connects with the meter via a hard wire? Is it acceptable that PIM connects to dispatch MDT that interfaces with a taxi meter?

Yes, it is the intent to ensure the PIM connects with the meter via a hard wire.

25. Page 6, Section 3.2, Subsection 3.2.3.1 - Can the City of Houston clarify which actions are considered vandalism?

An example of an act of vandalism would be the destruction of the device such that it no longer operates (e.g., the breaking of the keypad). This is only an example and not the full range of vandalism that could occur.

26. Page 8, Section 3.3, Subsection 3.3.1.7 - Can the City of Houston let us know what the acceptable timeframe is?

Once selected, the City will work with the selected vendor/vendors to determine reasonable time frames.

27. Page 11, Section 12.0, Subsection 12.5 - Please clarify which performance and service aspects will be reviewed by the City of Houston.

The City of Houston will evaluate all submissions based on the criteria identified on Page 13 of the Request for Qualifications, "Selection Process".

28. Typically taxicabs have different exterior and interior formats. Do you expect to have one design of equipment to fit on all cabs?

We cannot definitively answer this question at this time. Responses to this RFQ and options proposed may result in a single design or in multiple designs.

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29. If an independent or a small company does NOT have dispatching software, are you expecting our solution to include dispatching software?

No.

30. If the unit resides in the back of the cab, will an extra key pad in the front of the cab be required so the driver can key in his ID?

Respondents are asked to propose their optimal solution to this issue.

31. Do you expect the printer to be in front or in the back of the cab?

Refer to section 3.1.1.8. A receipt must be printed either by the meter or the PIM for every credit card transaction.

32. What is the time frame you expect to have the entire Houston fleet installed and operational?

Within six months to one year after the City's final determination on this issue.

33. Does the City of Houston provide with space to hold initial and continuous training?

This is an issue that will have to be addressed once a final determination on the technical solution is made.

34. Will there be more than one vendor selected to service the Houston taxicab market, i.e., will more than one vendor be "qualified"?

The City of Houston reserves the right to award to a sole vendor or make multiple awards.

- 34a. If more than one vendor is selected, will the City of Houston require uniform pricing between qualified vendors?

Yes

- 34b. If more than one vendor is selected, will the City of Houston establish pricing guidelines and/or permitted charges/fees/etc.?

Yes

- 34c. If more than one vendor is selected, will the City of Houston issue technical specifications as to the in-vehicle equipment that will satisfy the RFQ requirements (e.g., minimum screen size, wireless updating of content, 5-second GPS route tracking, etc.)?

Yes

35. Do the "pay or play" and drug testing requirements apply to vendors for out-of-state employees who do not participate in any aspect of the Houston contract?

Yes

36. Will taxi operators who fail to install or who fail to maintain in-vehicle systems be prohibited from operating and, if so, what is the mechanism for enforcing same?

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The Code of Ordinances allows the City to prevent a vehicle from remaining in operation if the vehicle does not comply with codified and/or mandated equipment requirements.

37. Will vendors who currently have interior advertising rights in vehicles for which they supply taxi-top advertising be required, as a condition of submitting a response to the RFQ, waive any such interior advertising rights? Will such rights be voided by the City of Houston if such vendor does not participate in the RFQ?

There is not sufficient information in the question to allow for an appropriate response.

38. Are vendors required to accept all brands of credit cards? May they accept a minimum number (e.g., three major card association cards)?

Note: Most cities require that vendors accept two major cards. They can accept as many as they want, but only require them to select two.

Please refer to section 3.1.1.2 related to credit card requirements. The solution must enable drivers to accept payments from all major credit/debit cards. For the purpose of this RFQ, "all major credit/debit cards" is defined as Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover Card.

39. Conflict of interest questionnaire, do we not have to submit this if we have not given any contributions?

Please refer to the response to question 12.

40. For the drug form on section C (No Safety Positions), can we have some clarification on this section? The work involved will most likely be contracted out and is basic installation (i.e., cabling and mounting brackets). Does this apply to us? If so, can we submit once we have contracted out the work?

Please refer to the response to question 13.

41. Resident bidder, we have a full time employee and a corporate apartment in Houston. The employee does work out of the apartment. Does this count as an office?

Please refer to the response to question 14.

42. Can you please get us the list of mwbe providers that currently install things for Houston fleets?


