AGREEMENT FOR COMPREHENSIVE FEE AND COST OF SERVICE STUDY SERVICES

I. PARTIES

THIS AGREEMENT FOR COMPREHENSIVE FEE AND COST OF SERVICE STUDY SERVICES ("Agreement") is made between the CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS ("City"), a Texas Home-Rule City, and MGT OF AMERICA, INC. ("Contractor"), a Florida corporation doing business in Texas.

### III. DEFINITIONS

As used in this Agreement, the following terms have the meanings set out below:

“Agreement” means this contract between the Parties, including all exhibits and any written amendments authorized by City Council and Contractor.

"Business Day" means any calendar day except Saturdays, Sundays and full-day holidays for employees of the City (as designated by City Council).

“City” is defined in the preamble of this Agreement and includes its successors and permitted assigns.

“Director” means the Director of the City of Houston Finance Department or such other person as he or she shall designate.

“Contractor” is defined in the preamble of this Agreement and includes its successors and permitted assigns.

"Countersignature Date" means the date shown as the date countersigned on the signature page of this Agreement.

“Deliverables” mean those items that Contractor is to deliver to the Director pursuant to the Scope of Services assigned to the Contractor under Exhibit “A” and described under Exhibit “G”.

“Document” means reports, charts, analyses, maps, letters, tabulations, exhibits, computer databases and diskettes, software, notes and other work products obtained by Contractor from the City or prepared by Contractor under this Agreement. “Document” does not include, however, the Contractor's proprietary methodologies, software or databases.

“Fiscal Year” means the City's fiscal year, which runs from July 1 through June 30.

“Mayor” means the Mayor of the City or his or her designated representative.

“Parties” mean all the entities set out in the Preamble who are bound by this Agreement.

#### IV. DUTIES OF CONTRACTOR

A. Scope of Services

In consideration of the payments specified in this Agreement, Contractor shall provide all labor, material, and supervision necessary to perform the services described in Exhibit "A" pertaining to the City Fees listed under Exhibit "H."

B. Coordinate Performance

Contractor shall coordinate its performance with the Director and other persons that the Director designates. Contractor shall promptly inform the Director and other person(s) of all significant events relating to the performance of this Agreement.

C. Time Extension

If Contractor requests an extension of time to complete its performance, then the Director may, in his or her sole discretion, extend the time so long as the extension does not exceed ninety (90) days. The extension must be in writing but does not require amendment of this Agreement. Contractor is not entitled to damages for delay(s) regardless of the cause of the delay(s).

D. Reports

Contractor shall submit all reports and progress updates required by the Director.

E. Payment of Subcontractors

Contractor shall make timely payments to all persons and entities supplying labor, materials, or equipment by, through or under Contractor in the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR SHALL DEFEND AND INDEMNIFY THE CITY FROM ANY CLAIMS OR LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF CONTRACTOR'S FAILURE TO MAKE THESE PAYMENTS. Contractor shall submit disputes relating to payment of MWBE subcontractors to mediation in the

same manner as any other disputes under the MWBE subcontract if directed to do so by the Director of OBO.

**F. RELEASE**

**CONTRACTOR AGREES TO AND SHALL RELEASE THE CITY, ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS, AND LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES (COLLECTIVELY THE “CITY”) FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR INJURY, DEATH, DAMAGE, OR LOSS TO PERSONS OR PROPERTY SUSTAINED IN CONNECTION WITH OR INCIDENTAL TO PERFORMANCE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, EVEN IF THE INJURY, DEATH, DAMAGE, OR LOSS IS CAUSED BY THE CITY’S SOLE OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE AND/OR THE CITY’S STRICT PRODUCTS LIABILITY OR STRICT STATUTORY LIABILITY.**

**G. INDEMNIFICATION**

**CONTRACTOR AGREES TO AND SHALL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD THE CITY, ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS, AND LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES (COLLECTIVELY THE “CITY”) HARMLESS FOR ALL CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, LIABILITIES, FINES, AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ATTORNEYS= FEES, COURT COSTS, AND ALL OTHER DEFENSE COSTS AND INTEREST) FOR INJURY, DEATH, DAMAGE, OR LOSS TO PERSONS OR PROPERTY SUSTAINED IN CONNECTION WITH OR INCIDENTAL TO PERFORMANCE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, THOSE CAUSED BY:**

- (1) CONTRACTOR’S AND/OR ITS AGENTS’, EMPLOYEES’, OFFICERS’, DIRECTORS’, CONTRACTORS’, OR SUBCONTRACTORS’**

**(COLLECTIVELY IN NUMBERED PARAGRAPHS 1-3, “CONTRACTOR”)**

ACTUAL OR ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OR INTENTIONAL ACTS OR OMISSIONS;

(2) THE CITY'S AND CONTRACTOR'S ACTUAL OR ALLEGED CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE, WHETHER CONTRACTOR IS IMMUNE FROM LIABILITY OR NOT; AND

(3) THE CITY'S AND CONTRACTOR'S ACTUAL OR ALLEGED STRICT PRODUCTS LIABILITY OR STRICT STATUTORY LIABILITY, WHETHER CONTRACTOR IS IMMUNE FROM LIABILITY OR NOT.

CONTRACTOR SHALL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD THE CITY HARMLESS DURING THE TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT AND FOR FOUR YEARS AFTER THE AGREEMENT TERMINATES. CONTRACTOR'S INDEMNIFICATION IS LIMITED TO \$500,000 PER OCCURRENCE. CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT INDEMNIFY THE CITY FOR THE CITY'S SOLE NEGLIGENCE.

H. INDEMNIFICATION PROCEDURES

(1) Notice of Claims. If the City or Contractor receives notice of any claim or circumstances which could give rise to an indemnified loss, the receiving party shall give written notice to the other party within 30 days. The notice must include the following:

- (a) a description of the indemnification event in reasonable detail,
- (b) the basis on which indemnification may be due, and
- (c) the anticipated amount of the indemnified loss.

This notice does not estop or prevent the City from later asserting a different basis for indemnification or a different amount of indemnified loss than that indicated in the initial notice. If the City does not provide this notice within the 30 day period, it does not waive any right to

indemnification except to the extent that Contractor is prejudiced, suffers loss, or incurs expense because of the delay.

(2) Defense of Claims

(a) Assumption of Defense. Contractor may assume the defense of the claim at its own expense with counsel chosen by it that is reasonably satisfactory to the City. Contractor shall then control the defense and any negotiations to settle the claim. Within 10 days after receiving written notice of the indemnification request, Contractor must advise the City as to whether or not it will defend the claim. If Contractor does not assume the defense, the City shall assume and control the defense, and all defense expenses constitute an indemnification loss.

(b) Continued Participation. If Contractor elects to defend the claim, the City may retain separate counsel to participate in (but not control) the defense and to participate in (but not control) any settlement negotiations. Contractor may settle the claim without the consent or agreement of the City, unless it (i) would result in injunctive relief or other equitable remedies or otherwise require the City to comply with restrictions or limitations that adversely affect the City, (ii) would require the City to pay amounts that Contractor does not fund in full, (iii) would not result in the City's full and complete release from all liability to the plaintiffs or claimants who are parties to or otherwise bound by the settlement.

I. Insurance

Contractor shall maintain in effect certain insurance coverage, which is described as follows:

(1) Risks and Limits of Liability. Contractor shall maintain the following coverages and limits of liability:

Defense costs are excluded from the face amount of the policy.  
Aggregate Limits are per 12-month policy period  
unless otherwise indicated.

- (2) Insurance in Full Force. Contractor shall provide and maintain the above insurance in full force and effect at all times during the Agreement term and any extensions thereto.
- (3) Form of Certificates. The Director may approve the form of the Certificates of Insurance and the required endorsements, but nothing the Director does or fails to do relieves Contractor from its duties to provide the required coverage under this Agreement. The Director's actions or inactions do not waive the City's rights under this Agreement.
- (4) Issuers of Policies. The issuer of any policy shall have a Certificate of Authority to transact insurance business in Texas or have an A.M. Best's rating of at least B+ and an A.M. Best's Financial Size Category of Class VI or better, according to the most current edition A.M. Best's Key Rating Guide, Property-Casualty United States.

- (5) Insured Parties. Each policy, except those for Workers' Compensation, Employer's Liability, and Professional Liability, must provide a separate endorsement naming the City (and its officers, agents, and employees), as a client of Contractor, as an Additional Insured on the original policy and all renewals or replacements during the term of the Agreement.
- (6) Deductibles. Contractor shall be responsible for and bear any claims or losses to the extent of any deductible amounts and waives any claim it may have for the same against the City, its officers, agents, or employees.
- (7) Cancellation. **THE CONTRACTOR MUST GIVE 30 DAYS' ADVANCE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE CITY BEFORE ANY POLICY IS CANCELED, MATERIALLY CHANGED, OR NONRENEWED.** Within the 30 day period, Contractor shall provide other suitable policies in lieu of those about to be canceled, materially changed, or nonrenewed so as to maintain in effect the required coverage. The acceptance of delivery by the Director of any Certificates of Insurance evidencing the insurance coverages and limits required in the Agreement does not constitute approval or agreement by the City that the insurance requirements of this Agreement have been met or that the insurance policies evidenced by the Certificates are in compliance with the requirements of this Agreement.
- (8) Subrogation. Each policy, except Professional Liability, must contain an endorsement to the effect that the issuer waives any claim or right of subrogation to recover against the City, its officers, agents, or employees.
- (9) Endorsement of Primary Insurance. All insurance coverages provided herein, except Workers' Compensation and Professional Liability, must contain an endorsement that

the policy is primary to any other insurance available to the Additional Insured with respect to claims arising under this Agreement.

(10) Liability for Premium. Contractor shall pay all insurance premiums, and the City shall not be obligated to pay any premiums.

(11) Subcontractors. Contractor shall require all subcontractors to carry insurance naming the City as an additional insured and meeting all of the above requirements except amount. The amount must be commensurate with the amount of the subcontract, but in no case less than \$500,000 per occurrence. Contractor shall provide copies of insurance certificates to the Director.

(12) Proof of Insurance.

(a) Before commencing services hereunder, Contractor shall furnish the City with Certificates of Insurance on industry standard form ACORD 25 and the required endorsements.

(b) Contractor shall continuously and without interruption, maintain in force the required insurance coverages specified in this Section. If Contractor does not comply with this requirement, the Director, at his or her sole discretion, may

(1) immediately suspend Contractor from any further performance under this Agreement and begin procedures to terminate for default, or

(2) purchase the required insurance with City funds and deduct the cost of the premiums from amounts due to Contractor under this Agreement.

The City shall never waive or be estopped to assert its right to terminate this Agreement because of its acts or omissions regarding its review of insurance documents.

(13) Other Insurance. If requested by the Director, Contractor shall furnish adequate evidence of Social Security and Unemployment Compensation Insurance, to the extent applicable to Contractor's operations under this Agreement.

J. Warranties

Contractor warrants that its services hereunder shall conform to the generally accepted professional standards with respect to the scope, quality, due diligence and care of the services Contractor provides under this Agreement.

K. Confidentiality

Contractor, its agents, employees, contractors, and subcontractors shall hold all City information, data, and documents (collectively, the "Information") that they receive, or to which they have access, in strictest confidence. Contractor, its agents, employees, contractors, and subcontractors shall not disclose, disseminate, or use the Information unless the Director authorizes it in writing. Contractor shall obtain written agreements from its agents, employees, contractors, and subcontractors which bind them to the terms in this Section.

L. Use of Work Products

(1) The City may use all Documents that Contractor prepares or obtains under this Agreement. In addition, the Contractor shall provide the Director with supporting schedules, flow charts or other analysis necessary to understand the reported findings and recommendations. Generally, this information is attached as exhibits to the final report; however, if requested by the Director, Contractor shall provide this information from its work paper files.

(2) Contractor warrants that it owns the copyright to the Documents.

(3) Contractor shall deliver the original Documents to the Director on request. Within five working days after this Agreement terminates, Contractor shall deliver to the Director the

original Documents, and all other files and materials Contractor produces or gathers during its performance under this Agreement.

M. Licenses and Permits

Contractor shall obtain, maintain, and pay for all licenses, permits, and certificates including all professional licenses required by any statute, ordinance, rule, or regulation for the performance under this Agreement. Contractor shall immediately notify the Director of any suspension, revocation, or other detrimental action against his or her license.

N. Compliance with Laws

Contractor shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations and the City Charter and Code of Ordinances in its performance under this Agreement.

O. Compliance with Equal Employment Opportunity Ordinance

In its performance under this Agreement, Contractor shall comply with City's Equal Employment Opportunity Ordinance as set out in Exhibit "B".

P. MWBE Compliance

In its performance under this Agreement, Contractor shall comply with the City's Minority and Women Business Enterprise ("MWBE") programs as set out in Chapter 15, Article V of the City of Houston Code of Ordinances. Contractor shall make good faith efforts to award subcontracts or supply agreements in at least 24% of the value of this Agreement to MWBEs. Contractor acknowledges that it has reviewed the requirements for good faith efforts on file with the City's Office of Business Opportunities ("OBO") and will comply with them.

Contractor shall require written subcontracts with all MWBE subcontractors and shall submit all disputes with MWBEs to mediation to be conducted in Houston, Texas, if directed to do so by the OBO Director.

Q. Drug Abuse Detection and Deterrence

(1) It is the policy of the City to achieve a drug-free workforce and workplace. The manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, sale, or use of illegal drugs or alcohol by contractors while on City Premises is prohibited. Contractor shall comply with all the requirements and procedures set forth in the Mayor's Drug Abuse Detection and Deterrence Procedures for Contractors, Executive Order No. 1-31 ("Executive Order"), which is incorporated into this Agreement and is on file in the City Secretary's Office.

(2) Before the City signs this Agreement, Contractor shall file with the Contract Compliance Officer for Drug Testing ("CCODT"):

- (a) a copy of its drug-free workplace policy,
- (b) the Drug Policy Compliance Agreement substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit "C," together with a written designation of all safety impact positions and,
- (c) if applicable (e.g. no safety impact positions), the Certification of No Safety Impact Positions, substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit "D."

If Contractor files a written designation of safety impact positions with its Drug Policy Compliance Agreement, it also shall file every 6 months during the performance of this Agreement or on completion of this Agreement if performance is less than 6 months, a Drug Policy Compliance Declaration in a form substantially similar to Exhibit "E." Contractor shall submit the Drug Policy Compliance Declaration to the CCODT within 30 days of the expiration of each 6-month period of performance and within 30 days of completion of this Agreement. The first 6-month period begins to run on the date the City issues its Notice to Proceed or if no Notice to Proceed is issued, on the first day Contractor begins work under this Agreement.

(3) Contractor also shall file updated designations of safety impact positions with the CCODT if additional safety impact positions are added to Contractor's employee work force.

(4) Contractor shall require that its subcontractors comply with the Executive Order, and Contractor shall secure and maintain the required documents for City inspection.

R. Conflicts of Interest

If an actual or potential conflict arises between the City's interests and the interests of other client(s) Contractor represents, Contractor shall immediately notify the Director in writing. The City Controller shall issue a letter of consent or non-consent to Contractor's representation, potential or otherwise, of the other client(s) within 10 business days after receipt of Contractor's notice. If the City Controller issues a non-consent letter, Contractor shall immediately terminate its representation, potential or otherwise, of the other client(s) whose interests are or may be in conflict with those of the City.

S. Pay or Play

The requirements and terms of the City of Houston Pay or Play program, as set out in Executive Order 1-7, are incorporated into this Agreement for all purposes. Contractor has reviewed Executive Order No. 1-7 and shall comply with its terms and conditions as they are set out at the time of City Council approval of this Agreement.

T. Additional Services

Subject to the allocation of funds, the Director may add additional Deliverables and services by giving written notification to Contractor. For purposes of this Section, the "Effective Date" means the date on which Contractor receives written notification of the addition(s). As of the Effective Date, each item added is subject to this Agreement, as if it had originally been a part, but the charge for each item starts to accrue only on the Effective Date.

The total charges for additions to this Agreement must never exceed 25% of the original contract amount unless:

- the additions are exempt from the competitive bidding or proposal requirements, set forth in Tex. Local Govt. Code Chapter 252; or
- the City acquires the additions from Contractor through a competitive bid or competitive proposal.

## V. DUTIES OF CITY

### A. Payment Terms

Contractor shall furnish the Deliverables and perform all the services set out in this Agreement in consideration for the City's payment of the total contract price of **\$200,802** for services described in Exhibit "A" with the Deliverables and Milestones described in Exhibit "G". The hourly rates for the various job classifications listed in Exhibit "F" shall be the maximum hourly rates that the City will pay Contractor and those rates shall remain in effect without change throughout the term of this Agreement, including the renewal years. In the event the Director requests Contractor to provide additional Deliverables and services as he deems necessary as contemplated in Section IV.T., the Director will pay Contractor an amount not to exceed \$40,000 for such Deliverables and services, as long as sufficient funds are allocated.

### B. Method of Payment

Subject to all terms and conditions of this Agreement, the City shall make payments to Contractor upon successful completion of each Milestone as shown in Exhibit "G". Payment is contingent on the Director's approval of each Milestone, upon which Contractor shall invoice the City at the end of each completed Milestone. The Director shall not unreasonably withhold approval of a successfully completed Milestone. The City shall pay Contractor on the basis of invoices

submitted by Contractor at the end of each Milestone and approved by the Director showing (1) a description of the services performed during the period covered by the invoice, (2) a summary of the hours worked by personnel classification, along with the applicable hourly rate listed under Exhibit "F", and (3) the amount the Contractor requests for payment. The City shall make payments to Contractor at its address for notices within 30 days of receipt of an approved invoice for such completed Milestone. All fees due to Contractor under this Agreement shall only be payable from certain Allocated Funds, as provided in Section V.(D). The City shall make all payments in accordance with Texas Government Code Chapter 2251.

If the City disputes any items in an invoice Contractor submits for any reason, including lack of supporting documentation, the Director shall temporarily delete the disputed item and pay the remainder of the invoice. The Director shall promptly notify the Contractor of the dispute and request clarification and/or remedial action. After the dispute is settled, the Contractor shall include the disputed amount on a subsequent regularly scheduled invoice or on a special invoice for the disputed item only.

C. Taxes

The City is exempt from payment of Federal Excise and Transportation Tax and Texas Limited Sales and Use Tax. Contractor's invoices to the City must not contain assessments of any of these taxes. The Director will furnish the City's exemption certificate and federal tax identification number to Contractor if requested.

D. Limit of Appropriation

(1) The City's duty to pay money to Contractor under this Agreement is limited in its entirety by the provisions of this Section.

(2) In order to comply with Article II, Sections 19 and 19a of the City's Charter and Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution, the City has appropriated and allocated the sum of **\$50,000** to pay money due under this Agreement (the "Original Allocation"). The executive and legislative officers of the City, in their discretion, may allocate supplemental funds for this Agreement, but they are not obligated to do so. Therefore, the parties have agreed to the following procedures and remedies:

(3) The City makes a Supplemental Allocation by issuing to Contractor a Service Release Order, or similar form approved by the City Controller, containing the language set out below. When necessary, the Supplemental Allocation shall be approved by motion or ordinance of City Council.

#### **NOTICE OF SUPPLEMENTAL ALLOCATION OF FUNDS**

By the signature below, the City Controller certifies that, upon the request of the Director, the supplemental sum set out below has been allocated for the purposes of the Agreement out of funds appropriated for this purpose by the City Council of the City of Houston. This supplemental allocation has been charged to such appropriation.

(4) The Original Allocation plus all supplemental allocations are the Allocated Funds. The City shall never be obligated to pay any money under this Agreement in excess of the Allocated Funds. Contractor must assure itself that sufficient allocations have been made to pay for services it provides. If Allocated Funds are exhausted, Contractor's only remedy is suspension or termination of its performance under this Agreement, and it has no other remedy in law or in equity against the City and no right to damages of any kind.

E. Access to Site

Contractor may enter and leave the premises at all reasonable times without charge. Contractor and its employees may use the common areas and roadways of the premises where it is to perform the services together with all facilities, equipment, improvements, and services provided in connection with the premises for common use. This excludes parking for Contractor's personnel. Contractor shall repair any damage caused by it or its employees as a result of its use of the common areas.

F. Access to Data

The City shall, to the extent permitted by law, allow Contractor to access and make copies of documents in the possession or control of the City or available to it that are reasonably necessary for Contractor to perform under this Agreement.

The City does not, however, represent that all existing conditions are fully documented, nor is the City obligated to develop new documentation for Contractor's use.

G. City Assistance

The Director's office and City Department personnel shall be available to render all reasonable assistance and shall, to the extent permitted by law, provide all books and records, information technology reports, and account analyses in the City's possession that are necessary for Contractor to perform services under this Agreement. The Director reserves the right to assign a member of the City's staff to assist the Contractor in the performance of this Agreement.

H. Reproduction Services and Workspace

The City shall provide reasonable on-site reproduction services to Contractor. Costs of special or extensive reproduction shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. The City shall provide

reasonable working space to the Contractor in locations maintained by the Director's office or other City Departments.

## VI. TERM AND TERMINATION

### A. Agreement Term

This Agreement is effective on the Countersignature Date and shall remain in effect for two (2) years, unless sooner terminated under this Agreement ("Initial Term").

### B. Renewals

Upon expiration of the Initial Term, and so long as the City makes sufficient supplemental allocations, this Agreement will be automatically renewed for one successive one-year term on the same terms and conditions. If the Director chooses not to renew this Agreement, he/she shall notify Contractor of non-renewal at least 30 days before the expiration of the then-current term.

### C. Termination for Convenience by City

The Director may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving 30 days written notice to Contractor. The City's right to terminate this Agreement for convenience is cumulative of all rights and remedies, which exist now or in the future.

On receiving the notice, Contractor shall, unless the notice directs otherwise, immediately discontinue all services under this Agreement and cancel all existing orders and subcontracts that are chargeable to this Agreement. As soon as practicable after receiving the termination notice, Contractor shall submit an invoice showing in detail the services performed under this Agreement up to the termination date. The City shall then pay the fees to Contractor for services actually performed, but not already paid for, in the same manner as prescribed in Section V unless the fees exceed the allocated funds remaining under this Agreement.

TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT AND RECEIPT OF PAYMENT FOR SERVICES RENDERED ARE CONTRACTOR'S ONLY REMEDIES FOR THE CITY'S TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE, WHICH DOES NOT CONSTITUTE A DEFAULT OR BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR WAIVES ANY CLAIM (OTHER THAN ITS CLAIM FOR PAYMENT AS SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION), IT MAY HAVE NOW OR IN THE FUTURE FOR FINANCIAL LOSSES OR OTHER DAMAGES RESULTING FROM THE CITY'S TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.

D. Termination for Cause

If Contractor defaults under this Agreement, the Director may terminate this Agreement after providing Contractor written notice and an opportunity to cure the default as provided below. The City's right to terminate this Agreement for Contractor's default is cumulative of all rights and remedies, which exist now or in the future. Default by Contractor occurs if:

- (1) Contractor fails to perform any of its material duties under this Agreement;
- (2) Contractor becomes insolvent;
- (3) All or a substantial part of Contractor's assets are assigned for the benefit of its creditors; or
- (4) A receiver or trustee is appointed for Contractor.

If a default occurs and the Director determines that the City wishes to terminate the Agreement, then the Director must deliver a written notice to Contractor describing the default and the proposed termination date. The date must be at least thirty (30) days after Contractor receives notice. The Director, at his or her sole option, may extend the termination date to a later date. If Contractor cures the default before the proposed termination date, then the proposed termination is

ineffective. If Contractor does not cure the default before the termination date, then the Director may terminate this Agreement on the termination date, at no further obligation of the City.

To effect final termination, the Director must notify Contractor in writing. After receiving the notice, Contractor shall, unless the notice directs otherwise, immediately discontinue all services under this Agreement, and promptly cancel all orders or subcontracts chargeable to this Agreement.

E. Effects of Termination

Upon termination, Contractor shall immediately turn over any work in progress to the Director.

## VII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Independent Contractor

Contractor shall perform its obligations under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the City.

B. Force Majeure

(1) Timely performance by both parties is essential to this Agreement. However, neither party is liable for reasonable delays in performing its obligations under this Agreement to the extent the delay is caused by Force Majeure that directly impacts the City or Contractor. The event of Force Majeure may permit a reasonable delay in performance but does not excuse a party's obligations to complete performance under this Agreement. Force Majeure means: fires, interruption of utility services, epidemics in the City, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, ice storms and other natural disasters, explosions, war, terrorist acts against the City or Contractor, riots, strikes, court orders, and the acts of superior governmental or military authority, and which the affected party is unable to prevent by the exercise of reasonable diligence. The term does not include any changes in general economic conditions such as inflation, interest rates, economic downturn or other factors of general

application; or an event that merely makes performance more difficult, expensive or impractical. Force Majeure does not entitle Contractor to extra reimbursable expenses or payment.

- (2) This relief is not applicable unless the affected party does the following:
  - (a) uses due diligence to remove the effects of the Force Majeure as quickly as possible and to continue performance notwithstanding the Force Majeure; and
  - (b) provides the other party with prompt written notice of the cause and its anticipated effect.

(3) The Director will review claims that a Force Majeure that directly impacts the City or Contractor has occurred and render a written decision within 14 days. The decision of the City Controller is final.

(4) The City may perform contract functions itself or contract them out during periods of Force Majeure. Such performance is not a default or breach of this Agreement by the City.

(5) If the Force Majeure continues for more than 7 days from the date performance is affected, the Director may terminate this Agreement by giving 7 days' written notice to Contractor. This termination is not a default or breach of this Agreement. **CONTRACTOR WAIVES ANY CLAIM IT MAY HAVE FOR FINANCIAL LOSSES OR OTHER DAMAGES RESULTING FROM THE TERMINATION EXCEPT FOR AMOUNTS DUE UNDER THE AGREEMENT UP TO THE TIME THE WORK IS HALTED DUE TO FORCE MAJEURE.**

C. Severability

If any part of this Agreement is for any reason found to be unenforceable, all other parts remain enforceable unless the result materially prejudices either party.

D. Entire Agreement

This Agreement merges the prior negotiations and understandings of the Parties and embodies the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to this subject matter hereof. No other agreements, assurances, conditions, covenants (express or implied), or other terms of any kind, exist between the Parties regarding this Agreement.

E. Written Amendment

Unless otherwise specified elsewhere in this Agreement, this Agreement may be amended only by written instrument executed on behalf of the City (by authority of an ordinance adopted by the City Council) and Contractor. The Director is only authorized to perform the functions specifically delegated to him or her in this Agreement.

F. Applicable Laws

This Agreement is subject to the laws of the State of Texas, the City Charter and Code of Ordinances, the laws of the federal government of the United States, and all rules and regulations of any regulatory body or officer having jurisdiction.

Venue for any litigation relating to this Agreement is Harris County, Texas.

G. Notices

All notices to either party to the Agreement must be in writing and must be delivered by hand, facsimile, United States registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, United States Express Mail, Federal Express, Airborne Express, UPS or any other national overnight express delivery service. The notice must be addressed to the party to whom the notice is given at its address set out in Section I of this Agreement or other address the receiving party has designated previously by proper notice to the sending party. Postage or delivery charges must be paid by the party giving the notice.

H. Captions

Captions contained in this Agreement are for reference only, and, therefore, have no effect in construing this Agreement. The captions are not restrictive of the subject matter of any section in this Agreement.

I. Non-Waiver

If either party fails to require the other to perform a term of this Agreement, that failure does not prevent the party from later enforcing that term and all other terms. If either party waives the other's breach of a term, that waiver does not waive a later breach of this Agreement.

An approval by the Director, or by any other employee or agent of the City, of any part of Contractor's performance does not waive compliance with this Agreement or establish a standard of performance other than that required by this Agreement and by law. The Director is not authorized to vary the terms of this Agreement.

J. Inspections and Audits

City representatives may perform, or have performed, (1) audits of Contractor's books and records, and (2) inspections of all places where work is undertaken in connection with this Agreement. Contractor shall keep its books and records available for this purpose for at least three years after this Agreement terminates. This provision does not affect the applicable statute of limitations.

K. Enforcement

The City Attorney or his or her designee may enforce all legal rights and obligations under this Agreement without further authorization. Contractor shall provide to the City Attorney all documents and records that the City Attorney requests to assist in determining Contractor's

compliance with this Agreement, with the exception of those documents made confidential by federal or State law or regulation.

L. Ambiguities

If any term of this Agreement is ambiguous, it shall not be construed for or against any party on the basis that the party did or did not write it.

M. Survival

Contractor shall remain obligated to the City under all clauses of this Agreement that expressly or by their nature extend beyond the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including but not limited to, the indemnity provisions.

N. Publicity

Contractor shall make no announcement or release of information concerning this Agreement unless the release has been submitted to and approved, in writing, by the Director.

O. Parties In Interest

This Agreement does not bestow any rights upon any third party, but binds and benefits the City and Contractor only.

P. Successors and Assigns

This Agreement binds and benefits the Parties and their legal successors and permitted assigns; however, this provision does not alter the restrictions on assignment and disposal of assets set out in the following paragraph. This Agreement does not create any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of the City.

Q. Business Structure and Assignments

Contractor shall not assign this Agreement at law or otherwise or dispose of all or substantially all of its assets without the Director's prior written consent. Nothing in this clause,

however, prevents the assignment of accounts receivable or the creation of a security interest under '9.406 of the Texas Business & Commerce Code. In the case of such an assignment, Contractor shall immediately furnish the City with proof of the assignment and the name, telephone number, and address of the Assignee and a clear identification of the fees to be paid to the Assignee.

Contractor shall not delegate any portion of its performance under this Agreement without the Director's prior written consent.

R. Remedies Cumulative

Unless otherwise specified elsewhere in this Agreement, the rights and remedies contained in this Agreement are not exclusive, but are cumulative of all rights and remedies that exist now or in the future. Neither party may terminate its duties under this Agreement except in accordance with its provisions.

S. Contractor Debt

IF CONTRACTOR, AT ANY TIME DURING THE TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT, INCURS A DEBT, AS THE WORD IS DEFINED IN SECTION 15-122 OF THE HOUSTON CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES, IT SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE CITY CONTROLLER IN WRITING. IF THE CITY CONTROLLER BECOMES AWARE THAT CONTRACTOR HAS INCURRED A DEBT, HE OR SHE SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY CONTRACTOR IN WRITING. IF CONTRACTOR DOES NOT PAY THE DEBT WITHIN 30 DAYS OF EITHER SUCH NOTIFICATION, THE CITY CONTROLLER MAY DEDUCT FUNDS IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE DEBT FROM ANY PAYMENTS OWED TO CONTRACTOR UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, AND CONTRACTOR WAIVES ANY RECOURSE THEREFOR.

CONTRACTOR SHALL FILE A NEW AFFIDAVIT OF OWNERSHIP, USING THE FORM DESIGNATED BY CITY, BETWEEN FEBRUARY 1 AND MARCH 1 OF EVERY YEAR DURING THE TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT.

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## EXHIBIT "A"

### SCOPE OF SERVICES

Contractor is required to provide the following services:

1. Conduct a comprehensive review of the various City Departments' fees as listed in Exhibit J and develop a comprehensive cost of service fee study, including the basis for the fees, for the City of Houston.
2. Review fees of multiple city departments that are allowed by the City through approved ordinances, CPI escalation increase, cost to provide services, and/or applicable cost of administrative support.
3. Work and meet with City staff to refine the project scope, purpose, uses and goals of the City's comprehensive cost of service fee study to ensure that the study is accurate, appropriate, and complete to meet the needs of the City. Review project schedule and answer questions pertaining to the successful completion of the study no later than nine (9) months after Effective Date of this Agreement.
4. Develop the total costs of providing services associated with each fee included in the study with special attention being given to administrative costs for each fee based on each of the fiscal year 2012 and 2013 actual expenditures. The two years of analysis includes developing the cost models for FY 2012 and data entry and report preparation for FY 2013 at similar staffing, organizational structure, and activity volumes. Any FY 2013 cost model adjustments required because of changes in types of fees charged, revised organizational structures, staffing adjustments (changes to numbers and types of positions performing user fee activities) and/or revisions to staff time estimates are not included in the scope and will need to be negotiated, if applicable.
5. Compare service costs with existing recovery levels and determine the necessary and appropriate rate of recovery for all fees included in the study based on all relevant factors including statutory limitations, market conditions, practices of neighboring cities and counties, comparable cities in Texas, best practices and other policy and service level considerations. Recommend a fee structure that ensures the City is recovering revenue at an appropriate level. Neighboring cities and counties will include Pasadena, Baytown, Sugarland, Missouri City, Harris County, Montgomery County and Fort Bend County. Comparable cities in Texas include San Antonio, Austin, Dallas and Fort Worth.
6. Compare costs to support different customer classes, i.e. residential, commercial, other governmental.
7. Develop and assess the effects of a transition plan for phased-in proposed cost of service increase recommendations. Propose a comprehensive general fee structure along with recommendations for future adjustments to user fees that are appropriate, competitive and consistent.
8. Prepare a draft study report that identifies each fee covered in the report and provides the cost of providing the service as well as current and recommended cost recovery levels. The report shall contain comparisons with other comparable local and national cities and other local

jurisdictions. In addition to the neighboring cities and counties and comparable cities in Texas listed in item 5, comparable national cities include: Los Angeles, Chicago, New York and Philadelphia. Study should include an estimate of the additional revenue that would be generated if the new fee rates are implemented. Determine if any modifications are recommended to the City's financial management policy statements or any other policies and procedures that impact the organization's financial standing.

9. Present a draft comprehensive cost of service fee study report to City officials which include the Finance Department, Mayor and City Council. Comments and concerns should be collected during the draft phase for potential revisions to the study as requested by the City.
10. Present the revised draft comprehensive cost of service fee study report to City Council to facilitate their understanding of the study and its implications for the City. Make necessary adjustments as deemed appropriate. This presentation will be under the guidance and at the discretion of the Finance Director.
11. Train Finance Department staff on the methodology of cost of service fee used under this Agreement in all facets of the work and all components of study to be used in and to ensure the ability to continue and prepare a cost of service fee study in subsequent years.
12. Prepare a final written report (20 hard copies and one (1) digital copy on CD/DVD bookmarked and indexed), documenting the findings of the study.
13. Any other services related to this Comprehensive Fee and Cost of Service Study as requested by the Director.

## EXHIBIT "B"

### EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

1. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, or age. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, national origin, or age. Such action will include, but not be limited to, the following: employment; upgrading; demotion or transfer; recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier or lessee agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees, and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the City setting forth the provisions of this Equal Employment Opportunity Clause.
2. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee states that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin or age.
3. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee will send to each labor union or representatives of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the said labor union or worker's representative of the contractor's and subcontractor's commitments under Section 202 of Executive Order No. 11246, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
4. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee will comply with all provisions of Executive Order No. 11246 and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor or other Federal Agency responsible for enforcement of the equal employment opportunity and affirmative action provisions applicable and will likewise furnish all information and reports required by the Mayor and/or Contractor Compliance Officer(s) for purposes of investigation to ascertain and effect compliance with this program.
5. The contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order No. 11246, and by the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to all books, records, and accounts by the appropriate City and Federal Officials for purposes of investigations to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders. Compliance reports filed at such times as directed shall contain information as to the employment practice policies, program, and work force statistics of the contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee.
6. In the event of the contractor's, subcontractor's, vendor's, supplier's, or lessee's non-compliance with the non-discrimination clause of this contract or with any of such rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part, and the contractor, subcontractor, vendor, supplier, or lessee may be declared ineligible for further City contracts in accordance with procedures provided in Executive Order No. 11246, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in the said Executive Order, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as may otherwise be provided by law.
7. The contractor shall include the provisions of paragraphs 1-8 of this Equal Employment Opportunity Clause in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontractor or purchase order as the contracting agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance; provided, however, that in the event the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the contracting agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.
8. The contractor shall file and shall cause his or her subcontractors, if any, to file compliance reports with the City in the form and to the extent as may be prescribed by the Mayor. Compliance reports filed at such times as directed shall contain information as to the practices, policies, programs, and employment policies and employment statistics of the contractor and each subcontractor.


